## CASE STUDY

# “I am grateful indeed”

“My name is Achol Geu Jok, and I am a mother of seven. I live with my husband and children.

To support my family, I collect firewood and make charcoal. My husband does not have a job. We survive on what I get from the sale of firewood and charcoal.

**Before your help, I was struggling a lot to feed my family.**

**It is hard and risky to fetch firewood and charcoal in the bushes, but I had no option.**

When LWF saw my struggle, they gave me two chickens to raise. My chickens have multiplied now. This helps me sustain my family.

**When I have an emergency like sickness, or when I have run out of food, I can sell one.**

Every day I work hard to provide for my children, and when they are grown, they will help me.

My hope is to educate them, but I’m worried I won’t be able to afford it.

In our community, there is a big need for care for the most vulnerable groups, such as the elderly and people with disabilities. I hope those who help us can support them.
