




CASE STUDY

"You have changed my life"

"My name is Atong Pach Kuai. I live with my husband and children.

We used to cultivate crops and rear animals. But when the floods came, they killed everything.

We escaped to a camp called Kondai ... but the desperation we felt was unimaginable.

Life was terrible - we nearly died of hunger. Our life came to a standstill. It is never easy to live away from home with nothing to sustain you.

We faced serious starvation and got very sick.

We settled in the open under the scorching sun. We didn't have any shelter. We lived under trees for some time before a humanitarian organisation came through and gave us building materials for a temporary structure.

We are not used to life in town - we only know of our village life where we cultivate and keep our animals. Life was very difficult.

Fortunately, the floods came with lots of fish!

We are grateful God made his ways clear and directed us back to start a new life by our river.

We moved to the riverside and ventured into a fishing activity to feed our family. Fishing has greatly changed our lives.

We were provided with fishing gear such as nets and hooks through LWF. Because of that, we survived.

When we get fish from the river, we split them, dry them in the sun, and then sell them at the market in Bor.

We use the money from the sale of fish to cater for our family needs such as feeding and medication.

Last year I felt sick and I was able to treat myself using the money from the sale of fish.

We have sent our children back to school. I have even been able to send some of our children to school in Kenya. We also bought a few cows.

We are gradually getting back to our ways of life. We are cultivating and keeping our animals again now.

Now our life is changed for the better.
