

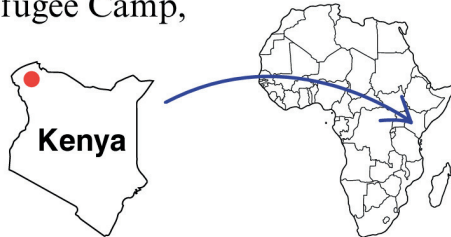

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<p>Who you help</p>	<p>100,000 children (across both Kakuma and Dadaab Refugee Camps) 13 pre-primary + 21 primary + 21 junior schools = 55 schools in total</p>								
<p>Why your help is needed</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It's critical that refugee children can access safe, quality education • Challenges to achieving this include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ◦ overcrowded schools e.g. 7 learners per desk designed for 3 ◦ over-age enrolment, because children have missed out on so much ◦ around 30% of school-aged children not in school ◦ shortage of learning materials e.g. ratio of 1:5 textbooks to students ◦ lack of trained teachers, because of difficult working conditions

CASE STUDY

“I feel happy at all times”

What if your class at school had 149 students?

Jal's does! He's 16 years old and in Grade 8 at Kakuma Refugee Primary and Junior School.

Jal is a hard-working student, and has big dreams for his future ...

... yet before your help to provide textbooks and other school materials, he found studying hard:

“Before getting the textbooks, life was very difficult for me as a learner.

Our teachers had to use their phones and tablets to search for notes.

We could only listen carefully to them. We could not do any learning on our own.

I felt like I was wasting time because you can't go to school without textbooks”.

Thanks to you, Jal's school received textbooks.

Now, students like Jal can borrow the books, and study by themselves at home and school:

“I feel happy at all times because when we are given a hard task in school, we use textbooks to research and do the task that we are given.

I am now working on my dream of being a politician and changing my community.

More textbooks would help me read the stories and biographies of other politicians and make me a better one in the future.

I want to thank the people of Australia for helping us with our education and may they continue their work. May God be with them”.
